Objective 2.1: To build institutional capacity in the area of energy management and efficiency in in campuses through the transfer of competences and networking.

Objective 2.2: To maintain and further develop the Energy Efficiency Units.

Objective 2.3: To scale up energy efficient best practices to the surrounding communities.







STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 3: Policy

Objective 3.1: To develop, or to update where they exist, policies and procedures in order to improve managerial capacities in energy use at campus.

Objective 3.2: To establish general guidelines for policies and procedures for energy use at campus.

Objective 3.3: To achieve national support for said guidelines (O. 3.2) in order to promote their implementation in other HEIs in East Africa.





STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 4: Training programmes

Objective 4.1: To develop and offer energy related training programmes to both HEI students' and workers in the energy field (lifelong learning), aiming at reducing skills gaps in addressing solutions to problems related to energy access and efficiency.

Objective 4.2: To adapt existing energy-related degree programmes so that they better meet the needs of the future employers.

Objective 4.3: To increase multi-disciplinarity of energy matters by introducing courses on energy in degrees other than the sciences and engineering.





STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 5: Mobility

Objective 5.1: To promote and facilitate staff exchange opportunity with the aim of sharing and furthering the scientific and technical know-how of all Parties involved.

<u>Objective 5.2</u>: To establish student exchange programme so as to share knowledge and best practices in energy use management.

<u>Objective 5.3</u>: To foster networking among the involved communities in order to scale up best practices in energy use management to other communities.





STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 6: Research

<u>Objective 6.1</u>: To encourage collaboration and cooperation of projects involving scientists, engineers and people from the user communities associated with each member of the Network.

Objective 6.2: To encourage collaborative participatory action researches among the communities of East Africa.

Objective 6.3: To encourage collaborative gender and energy efficient researches across East Africa.





STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 7: Dissemination and outreach activities

Objective 7.1: To disseminate research products to the community on innovation relating to renewable energy use and technology transfer.

<u>Objective 7.2</u>: To conduct campaigns on energy (conservation, sustainability, education) for the local communities, in particular with schools.

Objective 7.3: To promote the utilization (or adoption) of the findings of participatory action research in the communities under study.

Objective 7.4: To apply findings of gender relations towards energy efficient use in households.





STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES OF THE NETWORK

Objective 8: Institutional and Financial Sustainability of the Network

Objective 8.1: To integrate the Network's objectives with the partner institutions.

Objective 8.2: To develop actions to address Financial Sustainability of the Network to achieve a level of self-sustainability through own financing.

Objective 8.3: To obtain, if appropriate, donations and contributions from national, regional and international organizations.
